James Foy Etchieson, of Blytheville, died at the age of 85 on July 7, 2004. He was Past President of the Arkansas-Missouri Cotton Trade Association from 1959-1960 and became a member of the Southern Cotton Association when the two merged.

Foy was a 1935 graduate of Yarbrow High School and a veteran of World War II. He was a long time cotton broker. Foy served in many area civic and business organizations and helped organize the National Cotton Picking contest in Blytheville in the early 1950's. He was a very devoted family man.

Foy is survived by his wife, Juanice Walpole Etchieson, two daughters, Ronnie Shaw and Lou Moore both of Blytheville, four grandchildren and five great-grandchildren.
